Grant Allocation 2012-2013

The funding received from Pupil Premium in 2012-2013 has been allocated in the following ways;

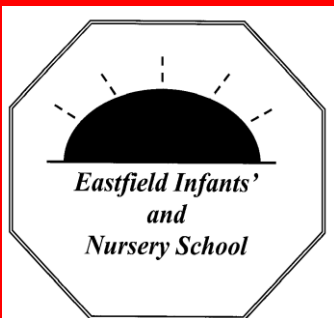
- Retaining 3 classes in Year 1 to keep class sizes small
- Increasing teaching assistant support throughout the school to focus interventions in phonics, reading and maths
- Providing materials and equipment to enhance learning
- Equipping a new teaching area for small group work
- Engaging the services of EWO to impact on attendance
- Providing weekly stickers and awards for excellent attendance
- Engaging the services of an 'Evolve' play worker to enhance children's self esteem
- Establishing 'After School' clubs to enhance children's fitness and confidence.

Impact Evaluation

Standards continue to improve across Maths and English in all year groups this year.

In Key Stage 1 those children accessing Free School Meals are all making at least expected progress from their Year 1 baseline, with many children surpassing their targets.

Attendance has improved in KS1 From 92.78% to 93.32% in Year 1 and from 90.72% to 94.59% in Y2. For children receiving FSM attendance has gone up from 89.65% to 90.09%.



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Pupil premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are eligible for free School Meals and children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months. This amount is £600 per child. There is also an amount of £250 for children whose parents are serving in the armed forces.
