Grant Allocation 2013-2014

The funding received from Pupil Premium in 2013-14 will be allocated in the following ways:

- teaching assistant support throughout the school to focus interventions in phonics, reading and maths £20,333
- Additional SEN TA support for short term specific interventions for individual children or groups £14,385
- Providing materials and equipment to enhance learning/support after school clubs/ provide weekly stickers and awards for excellent attendance £15,000
- Engaging the services of EWO to impact on attendance £500
- Engaging the services of an 'Evolve' play worker to enhance children's self-esteem £2,000

Impact Evaluation

Standards continue to improve across Maths and English in all year groups this year.

In Key Stage 1 those children accessing Free School Meals are all making good progress from their Year 1 baseline, with many children surpassing their targets.

- In maths all except 4 children receiving PPG achieved or exceeded their targets.
- In reading although 2 children did not achieve their target 9 children exceeded their targets.
- In writing although 3 children narrowly missed their target 12 children exceeded their targets.
- In Year 1 70% children met the phonics threshold.
- Attendance has continued to improve. The absence figure is now 4.48% which is in line with Lincolnshire expectations.
- Persistent absenteeism has reduced significantly to 2.5% again in line with Lincolnshire.
- For children receiving FSM attendance has gone up from 89.65% to 90.09%.



Pupil Premium statement 2013 - 2014

Pupil premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are eligible for free School Meals and children who have been looked after continuously for more than 6 months. This amount is £900 per child. There is also an amount of £250 for children whose parents are serving in the armed forces.
